

providers like Century Tel, or Country Cable. The end customer is responsible for lighting the fiber and communication services outside of the Town of Coulee Dam City limits.

So far, the Public Utility District has not been asked to make any contribution to this backbone fiber installation nor have we been approached by the School District about lighting fiber to the High School. This installation can be connected to our fiber in Grand Coulee at the School Administrative office, which is in Grant County but technically resides in the city limits of Coulee Dam. I suspect we will be receiving an application for service once the fiber cable construction reaches the High School.

- Private company owns fiber
- End use customer pays upfront and recurring fees and gets dark fiber
- We or other entity will charge for "lighting" fiber depending on what they want.
- Private company pays pole contact fees to City plus a % of revenue as a franchise fee.
